

Spiritual care is soul care. And soul care seeks to create the right conditions for people to explore their feelings and grow in connection with God and others. Sometimes this is through laughter, or music, or religious rituals and prayer. Sometimes, soul care means listening to regrets and losses that need tending, reminding a person they are understood and not alone.

The benefits are an increased sense of joy and peace and hope.

At Santa Maria we believe in the importance of good spiritual care for our residents and our staff. For this reason we have a goal to grow our capacity and train excellent Spiritual Care Providers. The primary way we I will do this is through our in-house education program (CPE) that runs from September to March. Students develop skills in evidence-based psychological and theological approaches to care for all people. Secondarily, we are investing time in matching residents with a growing number of screened volunteers. These volunteers come to visit through the week, as their schedule allows.

Our mission to improve soul care starts with the acknowledgement that every person is sacred; and for each sacred friend, we aspire to offer greater comfort and care.

SARCAN Virtual Bottle Drive

Did you know you can donate the value of your recycle bottle order to the Santa Maria Foundation?

When you use the Sarcan "Drop & Go" service that is available at all depots in Saskatchewan, it allows customers to skip lineups by leaving their order at the depot and have their refund transferred electronically to the Santa Maria Foundation.

All you need to do is follow these easy steps:

- 1. At home, separate your recycling put plastics, cartons and aluminum cans into bags, put glass beverage containers into boxes. Don't forget to include milk containers.
- 2. Visit a SARCAN Depot and look for Drop & Go
- 3. Follow instructions on the Screen. Type Santa Maria when prompted to enter the group phrase.
- 4. The amount of your order will be processed and paid directly to the Santa Maria Foundation.

Safety Codes at Santa Maria

CODE RED

CODE RED is used for a suspected fire.

At Santa Maria, you will first hear the fire alarm because all pull alarms and smoke detectors automatically trigger our system.

The Fire Department is notified through our security monitoring company.

Santa Maria holds monthly **CODE RED** fire drills for staff training purposes.

You will be asked to remain in the front Atrium area or outside upon arriving at Santa Maria during a CODE RED situation or during a practice drill. If you are at Santa Maria visiting a resident in a neighborhood at the time a CODE RED is announced, please listen for instructions. Most likely you will be asked to quietly and calmly wait where you are. Should things move to an evacuation (CODE GREEN), a staff member will direct you to an exit stairwell.
